

Drought Stress and Crabgrass!



Important Notice

2011 has been one of the worst years in recent history for lack of rainfall and drought stress. Grass under drought stress is in a weakened state and is susceptible to weeds, crabgrass, insects and diseases. Crabgrass grows rampantly in the thin and dry areas of your lawn and unfortunately due to current bylaw restrictions there is no product available to treat it. Therefore we recommend to pull out any crabgrass before it goes to seed and to reseed all thin areas in the fall.

When the cooler weather and precipitation returns, your lawn will recover. Your grass is not burnt or dead, it is simply in a protective state until favorable growing conditions return. We have applied a blanket application with your visit to help reduce the amount of weeds that have cropped up this summer from the intense heat. We have also applied a soil rejuvenation treatment at no charge to help your lawn recover.

We would like to remind you to cut high and water for longer periods to help your lawn during this time of drought. Also we recommend seeding any drought damaged and thin areas this fall.
